children observed as they

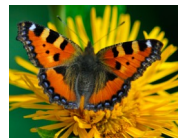
matured and

soft and fuzzy.

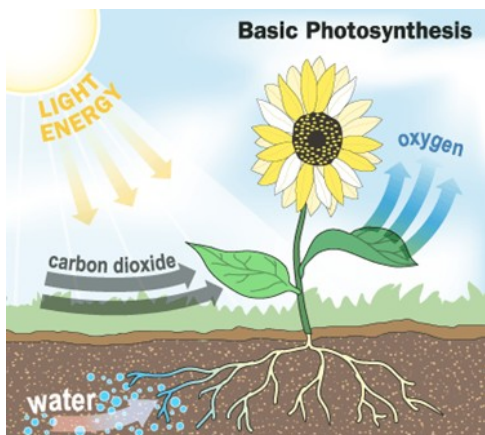
How thrilled we were to

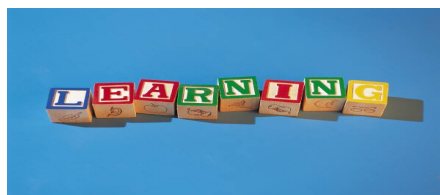

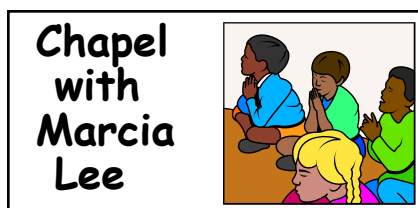

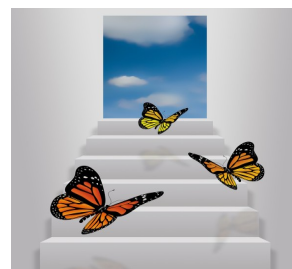

May has been an exciting and fun month! We learned about the life cycle of a chicken and saw how incubators work as well as the progression of a chick inside the egg by candling (or shining a light inside) a real chicken egg! While we waited for our eggs to hatch we learned about natural energy sources, such as the wind and the sun. We also created energy through chemistry by firing off a rocket with Mentos



and diet soda! It was so cool to see how far up the soda went! We then powered our own rockets by blowing through straws with the paper rocket on top.

As hatch day came for our chicks, we got to see a video of one actually hatching! We were also able to touch and hold the fluffy chicks. We saw the shell they came out of and noticed their 'egg tooth' on the top of their beak which helps them peck their way out of their shells. They will lose that as they get older.



Lastly, we learned about electricity and how our bodies are good conductors of it because of the amount of water we have inside of us. We played with an energy stick that buzzes and lights up when the circuit is complete. We tried to see how big a circle we could make that would still complete the circuit. It was a great end of the year exercise to physically show how we are all connected in the same way that God's love connects us to Him. And His Holy Spirit can travel through us in our words and actions every day.
