# "THE STRUCTURE OF GOSPEL WORSHIP"

(ISAIAH 6:1-5)

God "reveals" to men and men "respond" to God.

1. Revelation = Holiness (1-4)

"In God's display of His inherent greatness and transcendent distinction from everything outside Himself, His moral and ethical purity separates Him from sin and demands the same purity from His moral creatures."

2. Response = Confession/Repentance (5)

Confession means "to say the same thing" or "to agree" and is used in three senses in scripture:

- 1. To acknowledge the greatness of God in praise & worship
- 2. To acknowledge and repudiate sin
- 3. To verbalize basic doctrinal commitments
- 3. Revelation = Atonement/Assurance of Pardon (6-7)
  - 1. We deserve to die as the penalty for sin so Christ died as a sacrifice for us. (Heb. 9:26)
  - 2. We deserve to bear God's wrath against sin so Christ died as a propitiation for our sins. "In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins." (1 Jn. 4:10)
  - 3. We are separated from God by our sins so Christ comes and reconciles us back to God, reestablishing fellowship with him. (2 Cor. 5:18-19)
  - 4. We are in bondage to sin and to the kingdom of Satan so Christ pays the debt or the ransom to redeem us. (Mk. 10:45)
- 4. Response = Consecration/Commission (8)

How can we say to the Lord "we are yours?" (Rom. 12:1)
