The Form of New Testament Letters

- 1. *Introduction* includes name of author, name of recipients, a greeting, and a prayer
- 2. *Body* depending of the type of letter is may include instruction, persuasion, rebuke, exhortation, etc.
- 3. *Conclusion* May include travel plans (Titus 3:12; Philemon 22), commendation of coworkers (Romans 16:1-2), prayer (2 Thess. 3:16; Hebrews 13:20-21), prayer requests (1 Thess. 5:25; Hebrews 13:18-19), greetings (Romans 16:3-16, 21-23; Hebrews 13:24; 2 John 13), final instruction and exhortations (Colossians 4:16-17; 1 Timothy 6:20-21a), holy kiss (1 Thess. 5:26; 1 Peter 5:14), autograph (Colossians 4:18; 2 Thess. 3:17), benediction (1 Corinthians 16:23-24; Ephesians 6:23-24), and a doxology (2 Peter 3:18; Jude 24-25).
