stop and go signs Fire Safety we made, as a prop to hold up while we were singing the "Stop and Go"


song. (Stop and Go by Yancy Little Praise Party)

has been wonderful to watch as new friendships blossom in our classroom! We strive to help the children feel safe, comfortable and loved as they adjust to their new surroundings.


We are off to a great start with our established routines and

We started our month acquainting the children with the classroom environment, rules and routines. Our day begins with


'free play.' The train table, play kitchen and

amazing job during our Safety Days. We were so impressed by their ability to line up and exit the building quietly during our first fire drill.


