How does Theological Anthropology remain with God? Let's consider the following passages:

- 1. John 15:7-8 "If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. (8) By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples.
- 2. Colossians 1:15 "He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation."
- 3. Hebrews 1:3 "He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high."

How does Theological Anthropology end with God? Let's consider the following passages:

- 1. Romans 8:29a "For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son..."
- 2. 1 Corinthians 15:49 "Just as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we shall also bear the image of the man of heaven."
- 3. 2 Corinthians 3:18 "And we will, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, we being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit.
- 4. 1 John 3:1-2 "See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are. The reason why the world dos not now us is that it did not know him. (2) Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has

not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is.

Consider These Passages to Answer the Below Questions:

- 1. Genesis 2:18 "Then the Lord God said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone."
- 2. 1 Corinthians 11:8-9 (8) "For man was not made from woman, but woman from man. (9) Neither was man created for woman, but woman for man."
- 3. Ephesians 5:22-28 (22) Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. (23) For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. (24) Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands. (25) Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, (26) that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, (27) so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. (28) In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself.
- 4. Titus 2:4-5 Older Women should "train younger women to love their husbands and children, (5) to be self-controlled, pure, working at home, kind, and submissive to their husbands."
- 5. 1 Timothy 2:11-15 "Let a woman learn quietly with all submissiveness. (12) I do not permit a woman to teach or to exercise authority over a man; rather, she is to remain quiet. (13) For Adam was formed first, then Eve; (14) and Adam was not deceived, but the woman was deceived and became a transgressor. (15) Yet she will be saved through childbearing if they continue in faith and love and holiness, with self-control.
